1. Frequently Asked Questions

Why play Bridge of Allan?

It's a 9 hole course that is interesting and challenging. It has many hills, trees, bunkers and other hazards and this results in a rewarding experience. Designed back in 1895 by one of the most important characters in Scottish Golf, Old Tom Morris. The views of the Stirling area from the course are absolutely breathtaking. The first hole is one of the most challenging in the whole of Scotland and it was recently nominated for Scotland's "Best 9 Hole Course" by the Scottish Golf Tourism Awards

What's the course like?

It's 33 shots for par (66 if you play 18 holes). Playing time is 90-120 mins for 9 holes. From the Medal Tees the distances are 2560 yards for 9 holes. We also have yellow and red tees for a shorter, faster experience.

Can I play 18 holes?

Yes!! You can play round twice and there are different tees on some of the holes to mix up the challenge on the back 9.

How much is it?

Cost in Golf Season is £15 for 9 holes. £21 for 18 holes Mon-Thu, £25 on Fri-Sun.

How can I book?

Do you have a Clubhouse?

Yes! Open from 11am-9pm throughout the Golf Season. It serves hot and cold food, alcohol and soft drinks, has a TV and a lovely outdoor decking area where you can relax in the sunshine. It's an extremely friendly and relaxed atmosphere and visitors are very welcome!

Can juniors play on the course?

Yes. You are welcome to bring children to play with you so long as they are appropriately supervised. The same applies to their entry into the Clubhouse.

Cardboard scorecards are available in the changing room entrance area.

What do I do upon arrival?

Simply walk out onto the course in time for your pre-booked tee time, If you have any questions, you can pop into the Clubhouse and ask.

Do you have any lockers?

Yes, but these are for members only.

Can I rent a golf cart?

No. Our course is on a slope and is thus not suitable for golf carts.

Can I rent clubs?

No. We require visitors to provide their own clubs.

Can I rent shoes?

No. We require all golfers to bring their own appropriate footwear for on and off the course. We do have a shoe cleaner available though.

Can I bring a Golf Trolley?

Absolutely! We even have a few spares that are free to use for visitors if you need one. They are available on a first come, first served basis.

Is there a Car Park?

Yes. We have a good sized car park right at our clubhouse.

Are there changing facilities?

Absolutely. We have separate ladies and gents locker rooms and they both have their own bathrooms.

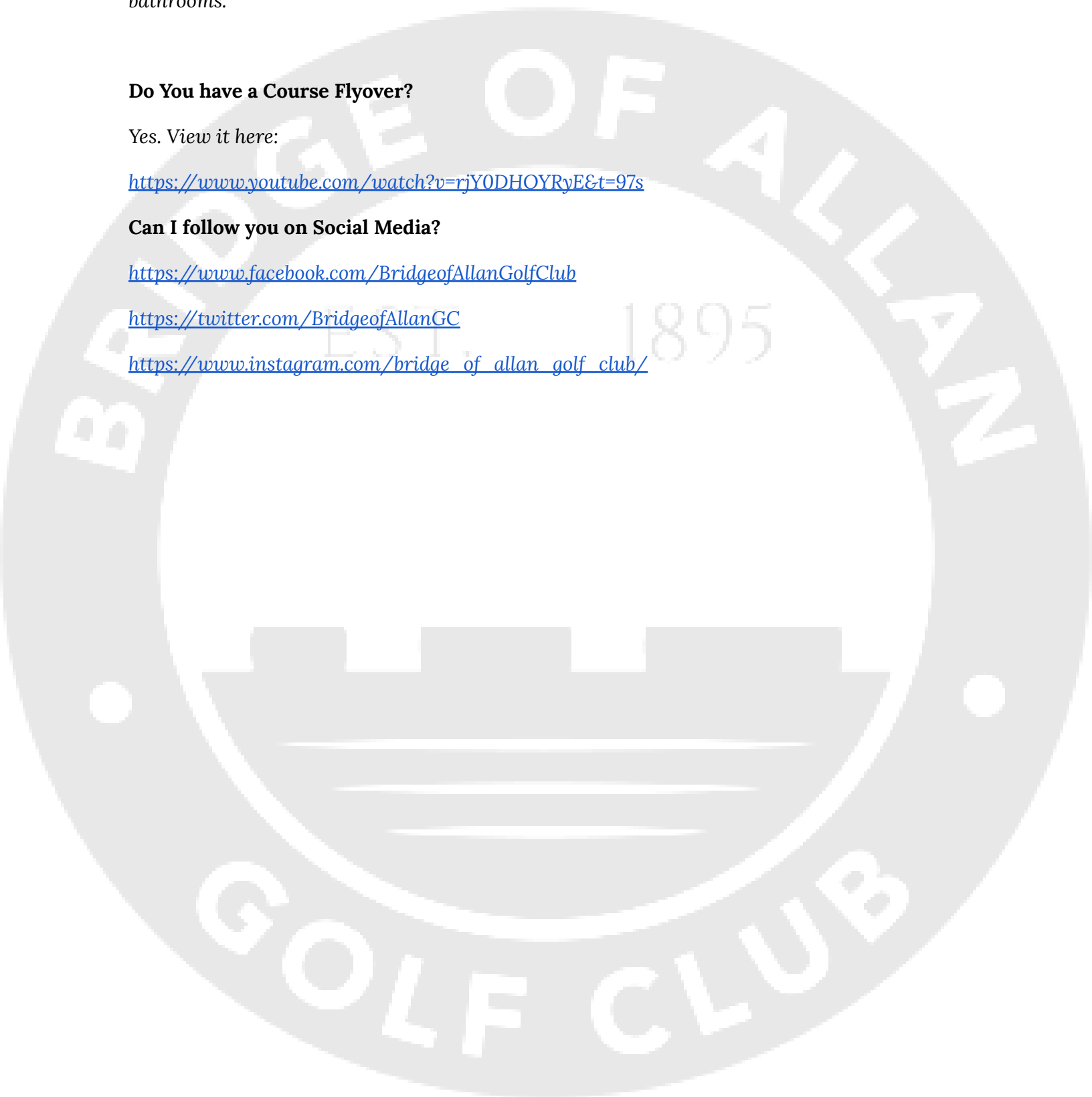

2. How to find us



The Best Route

The easiest way to get to our course is to drive along Bridge of Allan Main Street (The A9) and to turn off Blairforkie Drive (right next to the Allan Water Cafe). Then you follow that road until you see a sign for the Golf Club.



3. Golf Days

Can I have a Golf Day at your Club even though I am not a member?

Yes! Email marketing@bofagc.com to arrange it.

Which days can I have?

We can usually arrange a Golf Day on most days of the week other than a Monday morning, Thursday Morning or Saturday Morning. We can usually offer Saturdays after 3pm.

Can I have Catering at my Golf Day?

Absolutely! We would be able to offer you a combined price for either roll & coffee before your round or a meal after your round (or both) depending on the tee time you would like.

The team which does the catering is separate to the club so payment to them is separate from your golf payment. Our catering team are very friendly and accommodating, so if you just tell us what you have in mind, we are likely to be able to facilitate it.

Which tee time should I choose?

The clubhouse tends to open around 10:00 on Fridays to Sundays to catch people as they finish their rounds so if you are interested in food before your round a time of around 11am or later would be most appropriate.

How much is it?

Cost in Golf Season is £15 for 9 holes. £21 for 18 holes Mon-Thu, £25 on Fri-Sun. However, for larger groups we can sometimes offer discounted prices. If you contact us at marketing@bofagc.com with your numbers and requirements, we'll let you know what we can arrange.



4. Score cards and Dress Code and Safety

Score Cards

You can download a copy of our scorecard from <https://www.bofagc.com/scorecard/> or pick one up from the Changing Room entrance Area.

Visitors most commonly play off of the yellow tees.

Dress Code

Golfers are expected to wear clothing appropriate for golf.

NO denim jeans, football/rugby tops or shorts, tracksuits or vest type shirts are allowed on the course at any time.

Smart casual clothing may be worn in the clubhouse.

The staff reserve the right to ask inappropriately dressed persons to leave the course.

Safety

Please read the hole specific info as we have several blind greens and this will help to keep you and others safe while you play:

1st Hole: Tee shot hazard. Players playing 8th hole may stray on to landing area

2nd Hole: Tee shot over the hill. Ensure golfers ahead are out of range

3rd Hole: Shots from 4th Tee hazard. Golfers playing the 3rd hole should be aware of tee shots from 4th Tee

4th Hole: Blind Tee shot. Golfers should ensure players in front are over the dyke and the bell has been rung before teeing off

6th Hole: Tee shot hazard. Golfers should allow players playing the 5th hole to tee off prior to playing the 6th

6th Hole: Blind Tee shot .Golfers should ensure players in front are clear before teeing off

6th Hole: Blind Second shot. Golfers should wait for the bell to signify the green is clear

7th Hole: Tee shot hazard. Golfers should ensure players in front are clear before teeing off

8th Hole: Second shot hazard. Golfers should wait for the bell to signify the Green is clear.

9th hole: Please be aware of road users on the public road to the right of the hole.
